

# Goal and Objective





# Today's Situation



# How Did We Get Here?





# Where are we going?




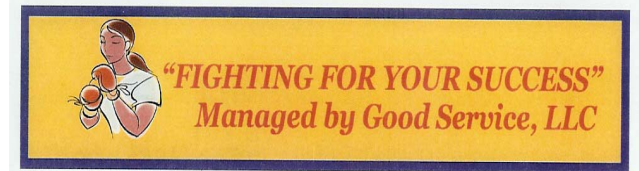
